*What is Shingon Buddhism?

Buddhism normally teaches that the more distracted one is, more time and more severe practice is required to achieve enlightenment. However, Shingon Buddhism preaches that it is possible for a person to achieve Buddhahood just as they are.



Founder of Koyasan: Kobo-Daishi Kukai

In 804, Kobo-Daishi travelled to Tang Dynasty China to study. He became a disciple of Huiguo, seventh Master and successor to the Shingon School of Buddhism, and eventually became the formal successor himself. Later, after returning to Japan. in 816 he consecrated Koyasan for Shingon Buddhism.



Rules when walking pilgrimage routes

1.Plan in advance Carefully consider the weather, your level of physical fitness, and any Carefully consider the weather, your level of physical fitness, and any equipment you may need, then choose a suitable path to walk. There are sections with no mobile phone coverage. Be careful of wild animals, such as bears, and deep snow in winter.

2. Take care of the pilgrimage routes as you walk. The pilgrimage routes are imprinted with many footprints offered in prayer. To avoid damaging the path, please attach rubber caps to the tips of your trecking poles.

3. Don tot leave trash.


Be sure to take all trash with you and keep the pilgrimage routes beautiful.

4.Do not take any animals or plants away with you. Do not harm or remove any of the plants or animals along the pilgrimage routes.

5.Be careful with fire
