

Rules when walking pilgrimage routes

1.Plan in advance

Carefully consider the weather, your level of physical fitness, and any equipment you may need, then choose a suitable path to walk. There are sections with no mobile phone coverage. Be careful of wild animals, such as bears, and deep snow in winter. 2. Take care of the pilgrimage routes as you walk

The pilgrimage routes are imprinted with many footprints offered in prayer. To avoid damaging the path, please attach rubber caps to the tips of your trecking poles. 3.Do not leave trash

Be sure to take all trash with you and keep the pilgrimage routes beautiful. 4.Do not take any animals or plants away with you.

Do not harm or remove any of the plants or animals along the 5.Be careful with fire Never smoke while walking the path, and use lighters with extreme Wakayama, Japan







The Kuroko-michi pilgrimage route played an important role as a lifeline for ransporting farm produce to Koyasan, since Koyasan's severe cold made it impossible to harvest crops.
