Святыни посещаются в порядке от ① до ⑦. Посетите храм в порядке ① → ② → ⑥ → ⑦.

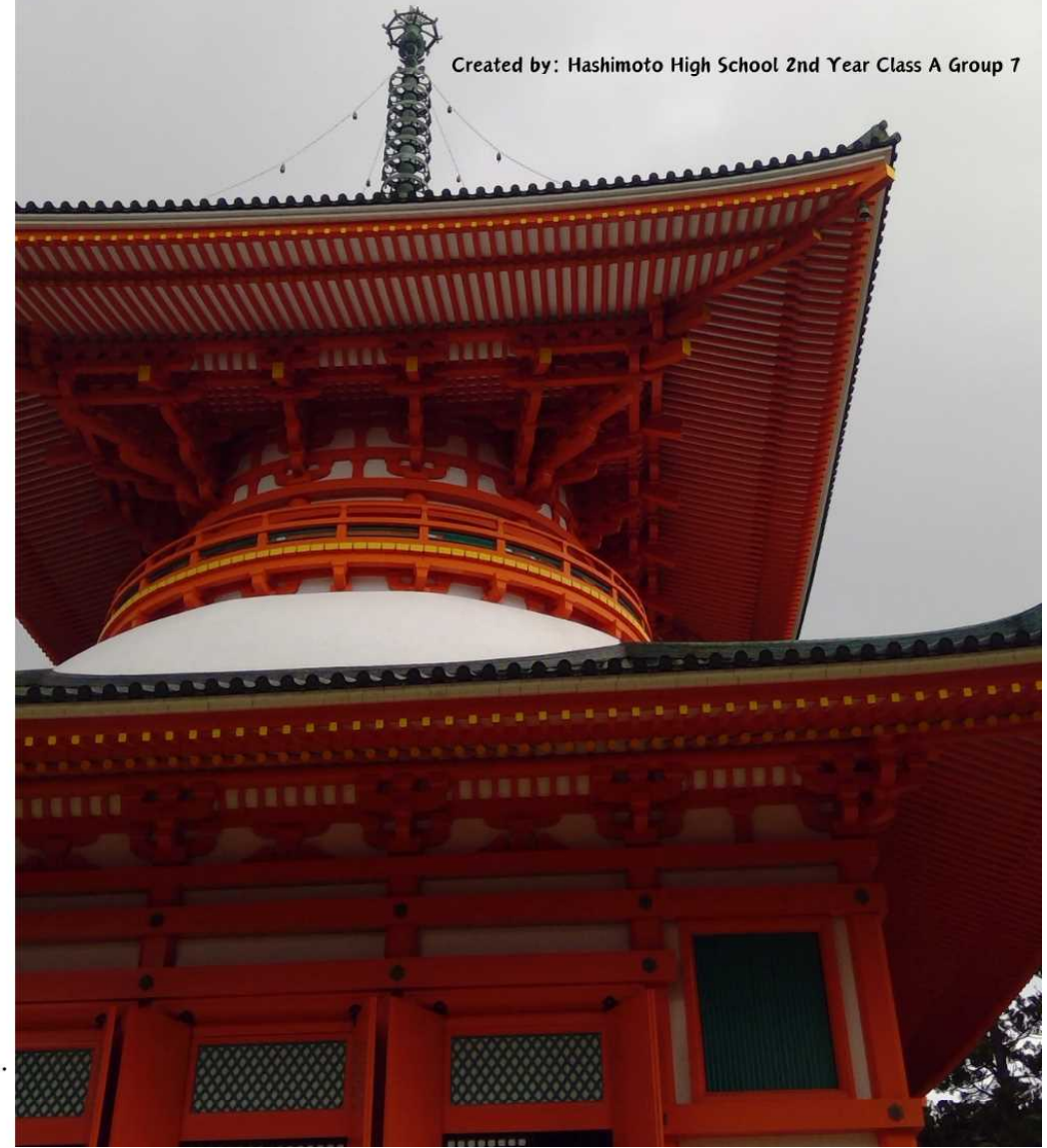

## YAKIMOCHI

## GOMADOUHU

A product made by grinding sesame seeds, dissolving them in water, and setting them on fire. It is typically eaten on its own. It's also smooth and rich like sweets.



## MEHARI SUSHI

### WHAT IS MEHARI SUSHI?

Sushi wrapped in lightly pickled mustard leaves. It contains "chopped mustard greens" and is very popular for its crunchy texture.
